

Packing Competition Rules

Contest to be held on Saturday March 23rd 2024 @12 pm @ Diamond Bar Main Arena AMA Rules will apply to all competitions. Any clean load beats a penalized load. Silver Belt Buckles to each winner. Please pre-register or check in for on-site sign-ups for the following:

Odd Load Packing: This is a two-packer team packing one live mule. The team will load the items provided, and tie on securely with a box or diamond hitch. They will then lead the packed animal on foot at a trot around the arena to establish if their load is stable and balanced. Contest will be held on Saturday at 12 p.m.

Adult and Intercollegiate Box Hitch: This is a speed competition. The live mule will have the boxes on before packing. One packer will put the load provided on the mule and cover the entire load with a mantee and then tie a box hitch. Ropes and mantees will be provided. AMA rules apply. This contest will be held following the odd Load packing. Adult and Intercollegiate Diamond Hitch: This is a speed competition. The live mule will have the boxes on before packing. One packer will put the load provided on the mule and cover the entire load with a mantee and then tie a diamond hitch. Ropes and mantees will be provided. AMA rules apply. This contest will be held following the adult/intercollegiate box hitch.

Youth Box Hitch: Youngsters under 18 years old: This is a speed competition. The live mule will have the boxes on before packing. One packer will put the load provided on the mule and cover the entire load with a mantee and then tie a box hitch. Ropes and mantees will be provided. AMA rules apply. This contest will be held following the adult diamond hitch. Youth Diamond Hitch: Youngsters under 18 years old: This is a speed competition. The live mule will have the boxes on before packing. One packer will put the load provided on the mule and cover the entire load with a mantee and then tie a box hitch. Ropes and mantees will be provided. AMA rules apply. Rendezvous Dutch Oven Cooking Competition Friday March 22nd Saturday March 23rd

Rules for the Competition

- 1. Contestants will provide their own ingredients to prepare their dish(s).
- 2. Contestants will provide their own cooking gear: Dutch Ovens, charcoal chimneys, cooking utensils, prep table, Dutch Oven cooking table or equivalent set-up, ash buckets, sample serving cups (4 oz. cups recommended), plastic silverware, serving utensils, hand sanitizer and food handlers gloves for direct food handling.
- 3. There will be no cooking on the ground.
- 4. The Mid Valley unit will provide hot briquettes and a shovel.
- 5. There will be a sanitation station set up with hot water and garbage cans will be available.
- 6. Each day Contestants will have their choice of cooking a main dish or a dessert or both.
- 7. Each Contestant cook station will be labeled i.e., Team 1, 2, etc. for public voting purposes.
- 8. All cooking needs to be done on site starting at 12:00 noon

- 9. Provide samples of your dish(s) to spectators at 3:00 pm and the public vote starts.
- 10. Each day spectators will vote using tickets for their favorite main dish and dessert.
- 11. Each day prizes and certificates will be awarded based on the public vote for the best main dish and the best dessert.

DIRECTIONS TO DIAMOND BAR ARENA

From South: Go north on 99 through Turlock to Keys road exit freeway Turn left turn left on Keys Rd. You will be headed west for 3 miles to Central Ave. Turn left again travel south about ¼ mile and enter Diamond Bar on your right.

From North: Going south on 99 pass through Modesto (good luck) and then Ceres, a couple of miles passed Ceres take Keys Rd exit and turn right on Keys Rd. You will be headed west for 3 miles to Central Ave. Turn left on Central travel south about ¼ mile and enter Diamond Bar on your right.

From I-5: Take the Patterson City exit and follow the signs to Turlock. You will traveling on West Main once you cross the San Joaquin river. Turn left Central Ave before you get to Turlock. Turn left and go north for about 4 miles and Diamond Bar will be on your left ¼ mile before you get to Keys Rd



1. Divisions:

- a. Youth under 18 at time of event
- b. Novice Newer riders, never competed in a trail type event
- c. Open Experienced in handling obstacles or have competed in a trail type event.
- d. Packer Equine/Rider plus pack animal through obstacle course.
- 2. A perfect go will score a 0
- 3. Deductions or points will be given at each obstacle for non perfect execution.
- 4. Refusals will be called out and once 3 refusals are accumulated, the rider will be asked to move to the next obstacle.
- 5. There will be 4 obstacle judges in the arena and 10-12 obstacles.
- Riders will be given a map with rider instructions for each obstacle.
- 7. There will be a rider walk through with the judges to verify that they know exactly what to do while on the course.
- 8. There will be holding areas where riders will have time to review their directions for each set of obstacles coming up. Riders will proceed only after they are given the sign from the obstacle judge to proceed into the next set of obstacles.
- 9. Pre-registrations will be accepted through March 17th. Those pre-registering will be first up in order of go. Registrations will be taken at the event but those riders will go after the pre-registered riders. The order of go for pre-registered riders will be sent out on March 20 via email.
